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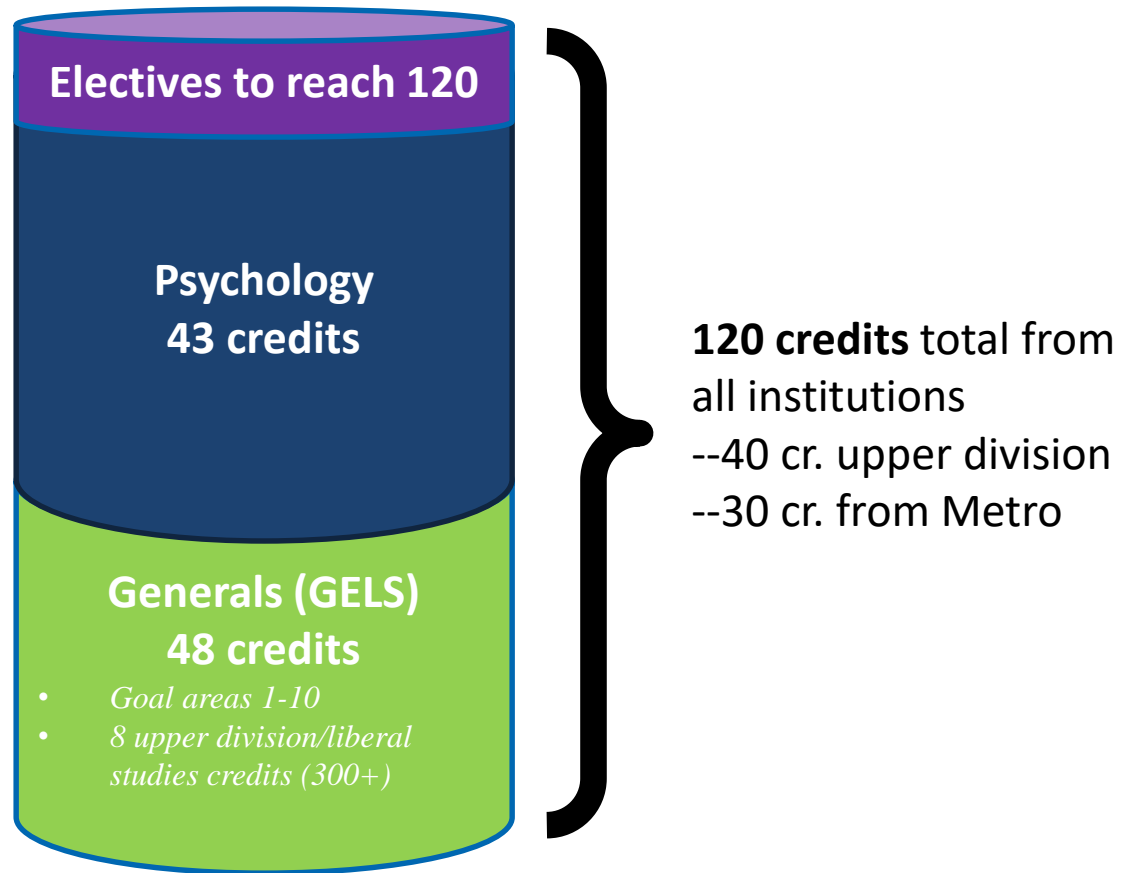

# Psychology Major

## **Start With:**

- PSYC 100 - General Psychology
- PSYC 200 – Fundamentals of Psychological Science
- PSYC 212 – Intro to Diversity and Ethics in Psychology

## **Then choose:**

- One course from 3 of the 4 Core Content Areas
- (Areas I, II, III and IV)
- 10 credits of Psychology electives

**PSYC 312** “Research Methods” – register for this *after* PSYC 200. It is recommended to take this half-way through your major.

**PSYC 405** “History and Systems of Psychology” - It is recommended to take this at the end of your major/last semester.

**“Application of Knowledge”** – It is recommended to take this at the end of your major/last semester.

You will take the 1-credit PSYC 407 course that will help prepare you for completing “Application of Knowledge”.
